Path to Spirituality

I need my Higher Power, whom I choose to call God today, every day. When I began my journey in recovery, my relationship with God wasn't very good. The one I started with was vindictive and out to get me. I was not worthy of him. But as I grew in understanding and practice and worked through the steps with my sponsor, I learned there was another kind of God, one that was loving, good and kind and within me and in each one of us. One that spreads all through us and holds us together. I find so many different belief systems and cultures, but I believe we are all one together to fight this disease and God does this for me with a daily reprieve no matter where we come from. I am given the strength to sponsor, serve and carry the message with this inner resource granted so freely to me. My spiritual awakening has been of the gradual kind and I keep a daily conscious contact with my Creator by living all these steps and principles continually.

Here I quote a writing by Bill Wilson: "Maybe there are as many definitions of spiritual awakening as there are people who have had them. But certainly each genuine one has something in common with all the others... Where a man or a woman has a spiritual awakening, the most important meaning of it is that he has now become able to do, feel, and believe that which he could not do before on his unaided strength and resources alone. He has been granted a gift which amounts to a new state of consciousness and being. He has been set on a path which tells him he is really going somewhere, that life is not a dead end, not something to be endured or mastered. In a very real sense he has been transformed, because he has laid hold of a source of strength which, in one way or another, he had hitherto denied himself."

I am so very grateful to Bill Wilson for my recovery. He had so many opportunities to turn his recovery into a money making endeavor. But instead through the first group conscious vote, decided "not to louse this thing up" as they said. And keep it simple to help people, one fellow to another and spread the word and recover together, one day at a time. Thank you God and thank you, too, Roseanne and OA.

"ACTION PLAN" OA Workshop

What a wonderful workshop we had on Jan. 7th at Palm Harbor Presbyterian Church! It was all about the tool, Action Plan. I learned how I could apply it to any area of my life. The presenter did an outstanding job of describing it in detail and gave personal examples of how she used it in her everyday life.

The discussion introduced me to various parts of an action plan which are SMART- that is, Strategic, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time Frame. Strategic means - is it goal oriented and something that will add to my quality of life. Measurable means--is it noticeable or able to be quantified. Achievable simply means--can it be done. Realistic and Time Frame pretty much speak for themselves. Personally, I applied this knowledge to some housekeeping goals I wanted to implement.

Others shared about applying an action plan to increasing their social life, dealing with their finances and marital relationships. Some talked about adding more laughter to their lives. I also wrote about adding more OA phone calls to my day.

An action plan is about what I need to do to stay in recovery on a daily basis. It is also about living a full and useful life in that recovery, as it says in the Big Book. Action Plan is about enlarging my spiritual life to be of even greater service to others.




