

Dear Fellowship,

I am sharing how the Florida State Convention enriched and may have just saved my life. For the last two months, I have been running by my self-will and was definitely out of control. Still going to meetings, I could not surrender, or do any work to help myself. Feeling negative about going, but I knew I wanted to. I met friends who admitted they were not abstinent, or who didn't want others to see physically them in an unhealthy place. But we came looking for recovery, and that is just what we found. My heart opened and became willing to listen and learn.

There were, to everyone, happiness, many who, year after year, were deeply motivating. Living success and sharing secrets of their recovery and that Overeaters Anonymous is the right place to be. What continually moved me were those who shared, let me into their thoughts. This Honest, Open and Willing sharing gave me the opportunity to hear how our fear based thinking can lead us into problems. One person shared something I have never shared.

Some of the workshops were about the joy in living the steps, and traditions, also, how to work it daily, the happiness in the men's meeting. Meetings like, joy in carrying the message to anorexic/bulimics, happiness GBLT, relationships and dating, also the perseverance in the program. AMAZING! Three keynote speakers, a boutique, a dance, meals, and amazing fellowship. Meeting people for fun, enrichment and taking phone numbers and email contacts.

Addiction is an isolating disease, closing us off from society, family, and self. We hid. We lied and in denial that we had any problem. I have an emotional disease that effects me physically, and the solution is spiritual. Learning acronyms such as: FROG = Fully Relying On God ... HOPE = Having Only Positive Expectations

I will spend this year urging us all to the take advantage of a this experience. FYI there will be scholarship money available, just ask about that opportunity.

Each day I am reminded that I have this disease. How do I know? I'm always aware of forbidden food in my midst. I remind myself calmly that 'that is not my food,' or 'I choose not to eat that today for my sanity' or I cannot control my program if I choose to take that first compulsive bite.'

The difference for me, however, is that those words can now be spoken without anger, without bitterness, and without feeling of deprivation that used to lead me to binge eventually. The need to eat compulsively has been removed on a daily basis, as long as I am willing each day to acknowledge my disease, accept it as a permanent condition that can be controlled by my dedication and action to the Steps, Traditions, and tools, and pray to God each day for a one day reprieve from my compulsive condition.

I recently returned to full-time work after years of part time work and raising children, and I have been so pleasantly surprised at my focus on my job and my lack of concern and interest in food that used to permeate my thoughts on an hourly basis. I ate through my last job; I'm working through this one! I am forever grateful to God, to my friends and compatriots in OA, and to this program for the miracle that truly does come if you wait for it.


